An Evening with New York Theatre Ballet

Sideslip

Sideslip was a 2023 commission by Norte Maar for Collaborative Projects in the Arts for CounterPoint10.

Minetta Creek

Minetta Creek is loosely based on the historical layering found in a small geographic spot, now known as Minetta Lane and Minetta Street in Manhattan's West Village. "Minetta" was changed by the Dutch from the original Munsee Native American word "Manetta" meaning, "evil spirit, or

"snake water." Now paved over and built upon, the creek still runs beneath the serpentine streetscape, and some inhabitants believe the Manetta spirit to remain. I was inspired by the idea of a ghost creek and decided to create a dance of contrasting timescales to embody water's everlasting persistence. Pauline Kim Harris' multi-layered ambient soundscape (violin plus live electronics and fixed media) incorporates pre-recorded elements performed on cello, viola, violin, voice and percussion (udu, shekere, claves). Fragments from Rachmaninov 's Vocalise and rhythm from the Lord's Prayer pulsate and drive the momentum, while contrapuntal layers weave the braided strands.

Minetta Creek holds both myth and history, using them as points of departure and emotional prompts rather than as bases for a linear narrative. As the dancers wind snaking paths across the space, hints of story and drama emerge, only to be reabsorbed moments later into the flow of time.

The Firebird

In the dark garden of the Immortal Kostchei, a tree glows, laden with golden fruit. The Firebird appears, attracted by the tree, and is pursued by Ivan Tsarevitch. He captures her and refuses to release her. She offers one of her magic feathers as ransom, and promises to return to his aid if he waves the feather when in danger. He frees her and she flies away.

Four maidens, led by the beautiful Tsarevna, enter the garden and Ivan conceals himself to watch as they gather golden apples. Attracted by the Tsarevna, he emerges from his hiding place. She warns him to leave as he is trespassing in the garden of the magician Kostchei, but he expresses his love for her and refuses to fl ee. Ivan opens the gates and a monster rushes from the castle followed by Kostchei. Ivan is captured and Kostchei tries to turn him to stone, but Ivan waves the magic feather. The Firebird appears and forces Kostchei and the monster to dance until exhaustion and then puts them to sleep. Ivan is instructed to steal a great egg that contains Kostchei's soul. He throws it to the ground, breaking Kostchei's spell.

The maidens celebrate their freedom from Kostchei's enchantment and the Tsarevna and Ivan are married, blessed by the Firebird.
